Mathematics, the language of science, is replete with elegant structures and patterns. Mathematicians often describe proofs or theorems as "beautiful" when they are

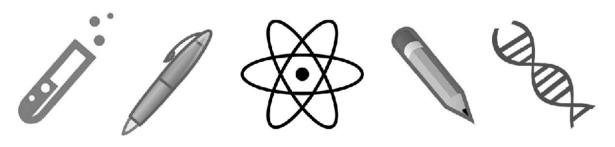
